PE– Physical Wednesdays!

What to bring to Nursery?

Please put **sun cream** on your child before they come to Nursery. (We cannot put this on your child or re-apply it during the day)

The children should bring in a named drinks bottle each day– there is a tray inside where they can keep it safe.

It is always useful to have a spare set of clothes at Nursery in case of accidents or messy play mishaps. These are welcome to be left on their peg.

Please ensure you have nappies and wipes if these are required.

Please bring your plastic wallet/bookbag– with link book inside.

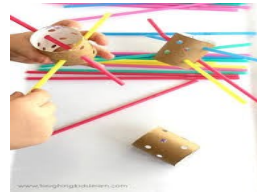

Fine motor skills

It is important that the children in nursery work on their fine motor skills to help them with pencil control when they are in Reception.

Here is some ideas you can try at home.



Punch holes in a toilet roll or kitchen roll tube and thread pipe cleaners through it.



Draw patterns on paper and use pinchy fingers to place buttons or sequins on top of the pattern.



Practise drawing these patterns this helps early writing
