What to bring to Nursery?

Please ensure your child brings a coat to
Nursery everyday, we go out in all weathers! **Wellies can also be left at Nursery on the wall mounted wellie pegs to keep feet dry!**

The children should bring in a named drink bottle
each day there is a tray inside where they can keep
it safe.

It is always useful to have a spare set of clothes at
Nursery in case of accidents or messy play mishaps.
These can be left on their peg.

Please bring your plastic wallet/bookbag– with link
book inside.

Indoor shoes

You may have seen our lovely new floor. To keep
this and our new rug as clean as we can we will be
making sure **outdoor shoes are for outside only.**

Please provide slippers or crocs

These can live under your child's peg in the little
grey baskets. They should be changed into each
session as you hang up your child's coat.

What are we learning in the Nursery?

This half term our learning will
focus on **Autumn and seasonal changes** We will talk about the changes we
can see around us. We will learn
about the weather and how we can
keep ourselves warm and dry.

We will be finding out about **colours**
and how to mix them and make new
colours.

Our Power of reading book is **The Gigantic Turnip**. We will be learning
about vegetables, farm animals, how
to work as a team and how to create
and tell stories.. Near the end of half
term we will celebrate Christmas.
We will find out about the Nativity
story, how different people celebrate
Christmas and we will end with a
wonderful performance of Christmas
songs at the Church.

Nature walk

Why don't you go on a nature walk, what can you see, what colours are there? Can you collect Autumn treasure and bring them to Nursery for us to explore and play with?
