<p>Children need to be able to think about a specific theme or topic that they are creating a product for. Children might begin to explain what their ideas are and why they might want to include it. Children will begin to use their own imagination to create products. Children will be introduced to existing products to support their imagination and ideas.</p>	<p>Children to work with adults and each other collaboratively to create a vehicle for someone who might help us. Children should talk together about the features of the vehicle and what might need to be included and where it might be going.</p>
