Prior learning	Future learning
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children will be familiar with the website 'Purple Mash' from their digital art unit in Autumn 2. They will build on their knowledge of the app to now create a fact file either about themselves or about a difficult area relating to their Summer 1 learning. They will recap their learning of digital art when they draw a picture to go alongside their fact file. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children will continue to use the skill of digital writing in some of their Year 2 units (Spring 2: Programming quizzes and Summer 1: Data and Information).

What pupils need to know or do to be secure	
Key knowledge and skills	Possible evidence
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children will need to become familiar with the different buttons on an online keyboard (letters and numbers). • Children will understand where the symbols are and how to input them. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children to create their own fact file on the website 'Purple Mash'.

- Children will understand where the backspace space is and its purpose.
- Children will understand that the 'enter' button will create a new line for them to write on.
- Children will understand that they can edit their piece of writing by clicking on the word.
- Children will understand the benefits and drawbacks of digital writing compared to writing with pen and paper.
- Children will learn how to save their work so they can continue working on it during the next computing lesson.

This can either be about themselves or relating to a topic they have already learnt about.

Key vocabulary

- **Keyboard** - A device with numbers and letters that inputs information onto a computer.
- **Digital** - We use the word 'digital' to talk about computer technology.
- **Fact file** - A short piece of writing providing true information about a specific topic.
- **Keys** - The buttons on a keyboard.

Common misconceptions

- If the children make a mistake in their writing, the children may think they have to delete all of the writing to make a correction. Children should be shown how to make an edit to their writing within a sentence.

Books linking to this area

Memorable first hand experiences

- Children will use iPads to create their own fact files on Purple Mash.

Opportunities for communication

- Children could then read aloud their fact files that they have created.

<p><i>Social, Emotional and Mental health</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Timer so they understand when they will need to log off.• Clear boundaries.• Online safety instructions made clear.	<p><i>Sensory and Physical</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Larger text/equipment.• Print offs instead of screen time.• Appropriate desk, chair, keyboard and mouse.
