Maths and Literacy

During Spring 2 the children will be basing their literacy learning around 'poetry.

The children will be taking part in lots of practical activities to develop their own ideas for verbally creating rhymes and poems. The children will then learn how to write verses to eventually create their own poem.

In Maths, we will begin by understanding what a fraction is and how to read different fractions. The children will learn to find fractions of objects, shapes and amounts. We will then move on to understand how to measure length and height using non-standard and standard units.

Reading comprehension

This half term, the children will receive reading comprehension home learning weekly. This will be sent home each Friday for the children to complete and return to school by the following Thursday. The home learning will involve an extract of text for the children to read and questions to be answered relating to the text. This will support children with their understanding of how to retrieve information from a text as well as how to make inferences. Please support your child to complete this each week.



Home Learning

Your child will continue to receive a new reading book at the end of each week, please ensure your child reads this as frequently as possible. Every time you child reads, they will be able to add a marble to a class jar. Once the jar is completely full, the class will have a celebration.

We ask children to participate in maths whizz at home, this is their maths home learning. The expectation is for children to spend at least 20 minutes per week on maths whizz.

Each half term your child will receive a set of spellings to learn. This will include between 10 and 15 common exception words. All children will have received a new list for this half term.

Please

encourage your child to practise these as often as possible. At the end of the half term your child will be tested on these words

before receiving a new list. Please use the spelling leaflet sent home at the start of the year for ideas of how children can practice their spelling.

The children will also receive reading comprehension home learning this half term.
